

# The numbers speak for themselves.

Despite having nearly 20% of students, CPS receives only 15% of education funding.

...get only **15%** of the funds?




CPS' State funding has decreased while all other districts have increased.

**State funding to CPS 2009 vs. 2017**




**State funding to all other districts 2009 vs. 2017**




CPS is the only district in the State required to pay for its own pensions.

If CPS were funded like the rest of Illinois children, it would receive an additional \$500 million from the State in FY 17.

**In 2017,** the State of Illinois will spend:



**\$2,437** per student on teacher pensions outside Chicago...



**...and \$32** per student for Chicago teachers.

90% of CPS students are children of color.

CPS is the third-largest school district in the country, and the largest in the State of Illinois.

And of those nearly 400,000 students:

**90%** are children of color.

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**17%** of CPS students are English Language Learners
